FACULTY

Our Faculty is led by Professor PJ Wormald who has a Rhinology interest. The rest of the Faculty is made up of very experienced and highly trained surgeons, most of whom have done Rhinology Fellowships. This blend of youth and experience ensure a high level of experienced supervision for all dissectors.

PJ's clinical and research interest is endoscopic sinus surgery and the anatomy of the sinuses. He has a particular interest in the development of a basic science research facility and an animal model for the scientific assessment of the pathophysiology of chronic sinusitis and the healing of the nose and sinuses after surgery.

Course numbers are limited to 40 dissectors, 20 observers and 15 nurses.
